

Strikelist GOTV Instructions

Strikelist is an integrated “Get Out the Vote” (GOTV) web application for turning out your voters on election day. Below are instructions for using it.

How to Log On

After logging in, you’ll be brought to a screen with a list of precincts. For each precinct, there are 3 ways to volunteer: **canvassing**, **striking**, and **phone banking**.

For Strikers

Your job as a striker is to listen to the poll workers as voters are declared, and to strike (remove) them from our list of supporters, so that we can stop contacting them and focus on turning out voters who have not yet voted.

Once logged in, you can access this part of the app by clicking on the “Strikelist” link for the precinct you are at. Once you open the “Strikelist” page for your precinct, all you have to do is **click on each person’s name as they vote to remove them from our list.**

The app will ask you to confirm your strike each time. Don’t worry – if you accidentally strike someone who hasn’t voted, you can easily undo that by clicking on the same name again.

We will also be using paper strikelists as a backup (a printed list with each person’s name repeated in three columns), so please cross out each voter’s name on that paper list as well as they are called. Please draw your line through **all three columns** of the paper sheet!

For Canvassers

Your job as a canvasser is to knock on the doors of identified supporters, and if they are home, to remind them to vote and log the response. If you do not contact them, then you should leave GOTV reminder literature on their door. You will be canvassing using paper walk turfs, and logging your responses in the app via the above URL.

Once you've logged in, click on "Canvass" for the appropriate precinct, and you will be presented with a street-sorted list of all supporters in your walk turf. You can find a given address by scrolling through the alphabetical list, or by using the search field at the top of the page. Once you've found the address that you're at, click on that address to bring up a window where you can log your response and include any additional notes about your interaction. You can also see if the voter(s) at this address have been contacted earlier in the day by other volunteers, either by canvass or by phone call.




If an address is grayed out and crossed off, then that means that all the identified supporters at that address have already shown up at the polls and voted! You can skip that address and move on to the next one.

For Phone Bankers

Your job as a phone banker is to call identified supporters and encourage them to go to their polling location and vote. It is important in your calls to stress how close the election is, and how much our candidate needs them to vote in this election. (Ask your GOTV Coordinator for a script if needed.)

Once you've logged in, click on "Phone bank" for the appropriate precinct, and you will be presented with a list of 10 supporters to call who most need contact from our campaign. To call a supporter, click on their name, and it will open a window with contact and demographic information, and a pane for logging responses. If you are using Strikelist from your phone, you can simply tap on the person's phone number, and it will prompt you to start a call automatically.



Once the call is over, you will be returned to this page, and you can log the outcome of the call by clicking one of the buttons on the screen. After you log the result of the call, you can add additional notes by clicking the pencil button next to the note in the contact log. Please include any information in the notes that you think would be pertinent or useful for volunteers from the campaign who will attempt future contacts with the voter.

You can exit the contact window by clicking the “X” in the upper right corner, or by clicking outside of the window. Once you finish calling all of the names on the page, you can refresh the page or click the “Load more people” button at the bottom, and the application will intelligently serve you 10 more contacts who most need a call. Keep on calling and turning people out to the polls!
